Eligibility Criteria

To apply for the [Te Akoranga a Māui PRIDoC Taura Bursaries](#), applicants must fulfil the following criteria:

- demonstrate whakapapa Māori
- be a student currently enrolled in medical studies at a New Zealand medical school
- be a current taura financial member of Te ORA
- agree to submit a PRIDoC Congress report to Te ORA at the conclusion of the congress

Application Process

You must submit:

- A completed application form
- A personal statement up to 500 words in support of your application. Your personal statement will need to respond to the topics:
 - Your demonstrated interest in Māori health
 - How the bursary will allow you to transform Māori health through supporting your personal and professional development

Selection Process

Bursaries will be awarded on the recommendation of the [Te Akoranaga a Māui PRIDoC Taura Bursaries](#) Committee jointly established by Te Ohu Rata o Aotearoa (Te ORA) and Te Akoranga a Māui, the Māori Chapter of The Royal New Zealand College of General Practitioners. Selection will be based on the following criteria:

- Māori student studying towards a degree in medicine at a New Zealand university.
- current taura financial member of Te ORA.
- demonstrated interest in Māori health.
- demonstrated interest in reo Māori.
